The Nashville Civic Design Center is wanting to know what young people think about their neighborhood - the good and the bad. We are asking you to make a map that we will show to the Nashville community at a virtual event on May 7th. Let your voice be heard!

Directions:

Draw a map of the parts of your neighborhood that you experience on a regular basis. It doesn't have to be accurate or look fancy. Before you draw the map, we recommend walking around your neighborhood or looking at an online map to refresh your memory.

Please include the following on your map if it applies to you:

- Places or streets you <u>like</u>. Mark with a BLUE dot and explain with words.
- Places or streets you <u>dislike</u>. Mark with an ORANGE dot and explain with words.
- Places or streets you feel <u>safe</u>. Mark with a GREEN dot and explain with words.
- Places or streets you feel **unsafe**. Mark with a RED dot and explain with words.
- What makes your neighborhood <u>unique</u> or <u>special</u>. Mark with a PURPLE dot and explain with words.
